
## OPTIONAL LIGHTHEAD BRACKETS FOR ADJUSTABLE FEET (TYPE B)

\*(Lighthead and Lighthead Brackets are purchased separately)


#### Assemble the lighthead onto the lighthead bracket:

- 1. Place the foam pad between the lighthead and the bracket, and then secure the lighthead onto the lighthead bracket.
- **NOTE:** Set driver torque force at 4.5~5.5kgf-cm.




### Assemble the lighthead w/bracket onto the adjustable feet (on either ends of lightbar):

- 1. Loosen the hexagon screws and adjust the height for the lighthead bracket to be inserted into the bracket body.
- 2. Using two supplied screws and secure the bracket from below.
- **NOTE:** Set driver torque force at 7.5~8.5kgf-cm.
- 3. Tighten the hexagon screws.
- NOTE: Set driver torque force at 120~140kgf-cm.
- 4. Repeat above steps for the other foot.



### Assemble the lighthead w/bracket onto the lightbar (on front/rear sides of lightbar):

- 1. Choose your desired front/rear lighthead location/s.
- 2. Slide 2 carriage bolts into each base groove for later foot installation.
- 3. Slide 2 more carriage bolts into the base groove.
- 4. Place lighthead w/bracket over the carriage bolt.
- 5. Attach a split lockwasher and a nut on each of the carriage bolts and secure it.
- NOTE: Set driver torque force at 120~140kgf-cm.



# LIGHTBAR ADJUSTABLE FEET (TYPE B) INSTALLATION MANUAL

## **PRE-INSTALLION**

To prevent damage to the lightbar and/or the vehicle, ensure that all equipment operates properly, carefully plan the location to mount and wire the lightbar and controlling equipment.

1. Ensure that the lightbar and mounting hardware fit the vehicle.

- 2. Pre-configure the desired lightbar functions.
- Determine:
- The location to mount the lightbar.
- The location to route the lightbar's Power Cable.
- The location to route the Function Cable. (e.g. To siren, switch box, console)

WARNING: Take extreme care when routing wires around airbag areas to not interfere with its proper operation.


- 4. Separate all electronic equipment wiring from two-way radio equipment wiring.
- 5. To avoid interference, keep two-way radio antennas at a minimum of 500 mm away from warning equipment.
- 6. When frame-ground the equipment, use the manufacturer-supplied ground locations in the vehicle.


# ADJUSTABLE FEET (TYPE B)

NOTE: If optional lighthead bracket(s) is purchased with this Adjustable Feet (Type B), go to Pg. 4 prior the following procedures.


- Install Adjustable Feet onto the Lightbar
- 1. Turn the lightbar upside down.
- 2. Place adjustable feet over the carriage bolts.
- Attach a split lockwasher and a nut on each of the carriage bolts, but do not completely tighten the bolts. Leave them loose enough to reposition the adjustable foot.
- 4. Loosen the hexagon screws and adjust the mounting feet to the desired angle. Make sure it fits the contours of the vehicle roof.

NOTE: Set driver torque force at 120~140kgf-cm.






Upside down view of lightbar with mounting foot



Loose the Hexagon Screws before adjustment




Side view of lightbar with mounting foot

## PERMANENT MOUNT

Installation includes centering the lightbar on the vehicle's roof, leveling the lightbar, and scribing and drilling holes for mounting the lightbar permanently to the roof.

- 1. Place lightbar on the vehicle roof at the desired location. The lightbar is usually centered on the door center post (B-pillar).
- 2. Adjust both mounting feet in or out as necessary until the foot pads rest near the edge of the roof or gutter where the roof is the most rigid. Make sure the lightbar and the mounting feet are centered left to right on the vehicle.
- 3. Level the lightbar by shifting the lightbar slightly forward or back.
- 4. Using the mounting feet as a template, mark two drilling holes on each end of the vehicle roof.
- 5. Carefully remove the lightbar and turn it upside down, and ensure that the mounting feet do not shift place.
- 6. Tighten the nuts that secure the mounting feet to the lightbar.
- NOTE: Set driver torque force at 115~125kgf-cm.
- 7. Drill four holes at the previously marked drilling positions.
- WARNING: DO NOT DRILL THROUGH the roof support structure that spans the distance between the driver's and passenger's side. Drilling through this will weaken the roof of the vehicle.
- 8. Place lightbar on the vehicle roof and align the mounting holes with the mounting feet. Secure mounting feet to vehicle roof with carriage bolts.




NOTE: After installation, frequently inspect the lightbar and mounting feet to ensure that all fasteners and brackets are tight.

# STRAP KIT MOUNT

The Strap Kit is designed for specific make and mode of vehicle. Before installation, ensure that the correct strap kit is used.

- 1. Place the lightbar on the vehicle roof at the desired location. Usually, the lightbar should be centered on the center door post (B-pillar).
- **NOTE:** Water may leak into the vehicle interior if the straps are improperly positioned. Ensure that the straps are positioned above or near the center door post (B-pillar).
- 2. Determine where the straps will attach to the vehicle.



- 3. Place the straps in position on the roof sheet metal as shown in diagram.
- 4. Use the straps as a template and mark the drilling hole locations.
- 5. Drill holes according to the marked locations.
- 6. Apply a silicone sealant (user-supplier) around the holes before attaching the straps.
- 7. Secure the straps with the strap mount screws.
  - NOTE A: Set driver torque force at 95~105kgf-cm.
    - **B:** After installation, frequently inspect the lightbar and mounting feet to ensure that all fasteners and brackets are tight.
- 8. Place the lightbar on the vehicle roof, and align strap bolt holes with lightbar mounting feet bolt holes.
- 9. Insert adjustment bolt through strap bolt hole all the way to mounting feet bolt hole.
- 10. Tighten bolts.
